Bristol, North Somerset and South Gloucestershire Integrated Care Board (BNSSG ICB) is responsible for making the best use of the NHS funds allocated to us to meet the health needs of our local population. The demand for services is greater than the resources available and therefore we have to prioritise the use of funds carefully. Our approach is to prioritise commissioning treatments, operations or drugs that are most effective in meeting the health needs of the population. All operations carry significant risks and where symptoms are mild or moderate it is likely that the risks outweigh the benefits. Not all conditions progress and when symptoms can be managed conservatively, that is the safest option.

The ICB does not commission Liposuction to reduce fat pockets and deposits. BNSSG ICB has determined that when considering the ICB's priorities, the risks, effectiveness and cost of this procedure does not provide overall value.



Liposuction– Plain Language Summary

Liposuction is a cosmetic procedure used to remove unwanted body fat. The aim is to alter body shape.

Liposuction involves sucking out small areas of fat that are hard to lose through exercise and a healthy diet. It is carried out on areas of the body where deposits of fat tend to collect such as buttocks, hips, thighs and tummy.

The results are generally long-lasting, providing the recipient maintains a healthy weight. It works best in people who are a normal weight and in areas where the skin is tight.
