QUESTION	RESPONSE
1. Does your organisation deliver the DSR service?	BNSSG ICB (Integrated Care Board) has a Dynamic Support Register which is in development which is currently a health only register which mental health colleagues can access to add people to the caseload held by the register. A whole system DSR is under development.
2. If your organisation works with others to deliver, please name all the other organisations eg the names of local authority or mental health trust etc involved?	System partners involved in developing the DSR include:  BNSSG ICB Avon and Wilshire Mental Health Partnership NHS Trust (AWP) Bristol City Council North Somerset Council South Gloucestershire Council Sirona Care and Health
3. Do you have a digital DSR?	Not at this time, but a digital solution is part of the ongoing development.

4. Do you have a digital dynamic risk register in place?	No, but we do use AWP's electronic record keeping system for CAMHS to pull data on our current DSR.
5. How many individuals do you have in total on your DSR?	139
6. Can you break them down into Red, Amber and Green and if so, how many of each do you have?	Current DSR focusses on RAG Red rating but broader oversight part of system development.
7. If so what sort of system is it, please state type eg spreadsheet, database or specialist software and if specialist software, state the name of the software supplier.	We do not have a digital portal specifically for the DSR but the procurement of this is being scoped as part of the DSR development.
8. Regarding connectivity of the system in use, does this system integrate with other local systems such as NHS spine, RIO patient demographic service, Emis, SystemOne, Vision etc.	Again, this functionality is being considered as part of the scoping work.
