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The questions below which I would like you to answer are designed to help me understand:

- how much money your integrated care board (ICB) spent on hospice services for children and young people with life-limiting or life-threatening conditions in 2023/24
- how many children and young people with life-limiting or life-threatening conditions in your ICB footprint accessed hospice care during 2023/24
- how much money your integrated care board (ICB) plans to spend on hospice services for children and young people with life-limiting or life-threatening conditions during 2024/25, excluding the £25 million Children's Hospice Grant funding that NHS England has asked every ICB to distribute.

In order to help you meet my request, I provide definitions to the terms I use in my questions below:

## Life-limiting and life-threatening conditions

"Life-limiting conditions are those for which there is no reasonable hope of cure and from which children will die. Some of these conditions cause slow deterioration over time rendering the child increasingly dependent on parents and carers.

Life-threatening conditions are those for which curative treatment may be feasible but can fail, such as cancer."

Therefore, the financial summary provided is for 01/04/2023 to 31/03/2024 inclusive (not 06/04 to 05/04).  A total of £738,047.28 funding was provided to the children's hospices, by BNSSG ICB. The breakdown of finances per hospice is as follows:  • A total of £555,524.20 was provided to Children's Hospice South West • A total of £182,523.08 was provided to Jessie May

Recurrent finances were agreed with the hospices via NHS Standard Contracts. Additional, non-recurrent funding was provided for fixed-term end of life care project work.
