How many WHHs are being developed or expanded in your ICS using DHSC's £25 million transformation fund?	We are not launching standalone, separate 'hubs'. Instead, we are working with groups of local general practices called Primary Care Networks to bolster and improve their women's health services. In some areas, this will involve setting up a 'hub' clinic between practices for some women's health services, such the provision of coils and implants.





	We intend to work with all 20 Primary Care Networks in Bristol, North Somerset and South Gloucestershire.
4. Are you on track to have at least one operational WHH in your ICS providing at least 2 core services (as outlined in the WHH core specification) by end of July 2024?	Yes.
