<p><b>For each sub-ICB location (using the latest boundaries) in your area, could you provide the number of young people aged 11 to 25 inclusive who presented in A&amp;E or urgent care with a mental health diagnosis in calendar years 2017, 2019, 2021, and 2023?</b></p> <p><b>Additionally, please split this data into two age groups: 11-18 and 19-25.</b></p> <p>Please include diagnoses with the following ICD-10 codes in any diagnostic position:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>F20-29: Schizophrenia, schizotypal and delusional disorders</li><li>F30-39: Mood disorders</li><li>F40-49: Neurotic, stress-related and somatoform disorders</li><li>F50-59: Behavioural syndromes associated with physiological disturbances and physical factors</li><li>F60-69: Disorders of adult personality and behaviour</li><li>F90-98: Behavioural and emotional disorders with onset usually occurring in childhood and adolescence</li><li>F99: Unspecified mental disorder</li></ul>	<p>A&amp;E and Urgent care attendance data are reported in the Emergency Care Data Set (ECDS) which was introduced in 2017.</p> <p>ECDS does not code diagnosis using ICD10, instead it used SNOMED coding. A Snomed to ICD10 mapping tool was used to identify relevant codes for stated diagnoses.</p> <p>The following table reports a count of individuals who attended an A&amp;E Department located within the BNSSG boundaries once or more and had a corresponding diagnosis code in any diagnosis position.
