Any <b>audits, internal reports, or evaluations</b> your ICB has conducted on medicines wastage or medicines optimisation.	The exact scale of medicines wastage is difficult to estimate.  The ICB ran an audit in six community pharmacies in July 2024. The audit revealed a total of 1,406 uncollected items, which were dispensed for 1,042 patients. The cost of these uncollected medicines was £12,967.34. However, it should be noted that these medicines were returned to stock rather than wasted, so there was no financial loss to the NHS in terms of prescribing cost (however pharmacist/ support staff time wasted).





4. Whether your ICB supports or commissions any initiatives, technologies, or systems to reduce or monitor medicines waste.

The ICB is running a public facing waste communication aimed to highlight – 'only order what you need'.
