When was the formulary start date, and when will it end or is expected to be renewed?	Existing formularies:  Stoma – Start date June 2024, review date June 2027.  Urology appliances – Start date Apr 2025, review date April 2028.

If this is to deliver cost-improvement/savings, please quantify what savings the formulary has delivered to your organisation each year since it was active?	To optimise the use of products, provide highest possible quality of care to patients, improve patient outcomes and ensure financial sustainability.





5.	Which part of your organisation benefits from any Formulary savings?	Savings are made across the BNSSG (Bristol, North Somerset and South Gloucestershire) integrated care system in.
6.	What is the process for renewal?	Medicines Optimisation team will automatically initiate the renewal process 3 months before the review date of the existing formulary. The team will liaise with specialist healthcare providers and healthcare professionals to review current prescribing and products available in the Drug Tariff. Specialists will appraise products and glean views of patients before deciding on formulary inclusion.
7.	Where new, innovative products are launched while the formulary is live, what is the process for reviewing these and adding to the formulary?
