Please contact them directly for further details of the provision available: https://www.awp.nhs.uk/contact-us/freedom-information</p> <p>Urgent mental health care centres: There are no mental health specific urgent care centres in BNSSG, however, there are two safe haven services provided by the voluntary sector (one of which is in Bristol), details of which are listed in question 2. In addition, individuals contacting 111, option 2, are able to access urgent mental health care and support. This provision is available 24/7.</p>

	<p>Other emergency mental health support provisions: A specialist mental health ambulance provision is in place across BNSSG and this can be deployed by emergency responders to individuals in a mental health crisis. This provision is available 24/7. Psychiatric Liaison support is available at both UHBW (University Hospitals Bristol and Weston NHS Foundation Trust) and NBT (North Bristol NHS Trust).</p>
