1. Current FND Services in Your Area a. Do you commission any specialist services for FND (neurology, neuro-physiotherapy, neuro-rehabilitation, neuropsychiatry/psychology, MDT clinics, etc.)? b. Please list the relevant services and locations.	 a. There are specialist FND (Functional Neurological Disorder) services provided in BNSSG (Bristol, North Somerset and South Gloucestershire). b. Functional neurological services are part of Neuropsychiatry at North Bristol NHS Trust (NBT). The team in the neuropsychiatry service are a mix of professionals from different disciplines including: Doctors in psychiatry and neurology. Nurse therapists trained in physical and mental health. Psychological therapy. Physiotherapy. Occupational therapy. The service is provided at: Rosa Burden Centre for Neuropsychiatry Southmead Hospital Southmead Road Bristol BS10 5NB

- and d. The Neuropsychiatry service accepts referrals from GPs, neurologists and psychiatrists. The service is a specialised, tertiary service and will accept referrals from across England.
 Referrals from outside of England require funding arrangements prior to acceptance.
